

Pilot Education Programme, leading to World Space Week (4th–10th October 2016)

Outline Timetable

- January. Find people to help regionally facilitate (at least one person for each major region/country) the LM1/WSW pilot project. Produce a presentation with a written brief for them to work to. **Achieved.**
- February to March. Facilitators promote, communicate and disseminate information to their regional schools, colleges, institutions, etc.
- March. Decide which schools, colleges, etc will participate in the first year LM1/WSW project. Plan workshops for volunteer teachers, ideally as part of conferences that already have teacher attendance, to identify pilot content. Agree WSW 2016 competition(s). Create initial teacher toolkit.
- Spring/Summer. Help teachers plan for WSW 2016. Hold workshops as required. Develop teacher toolkit.
- Summer. Promote via social media the WSW project and start the call for the competition(s), judging, etc.
- Leading up to and during WSW 2016. Use social media right before and during WSW 2016. Have students and teachers submit their work to show what they have worked on. Promote communication, exchange of ideas, collaboration etc, in preparation for the academic year leading up to WSW 2017.
- During WSW 2016. Hold the judging. Communicate winners and promote on social media.
- Remainder of 2016/2017 academic year. Pilot educational activities as required.
